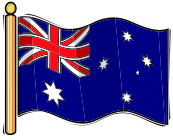

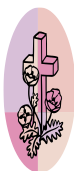

Hussif History

Sewing kits used to be known as hussifs, a contraction of housewife, and were used in the 18th century by sailors and soldiers for running repairs and lost buttons. A hussif was a small roll of flannel with a padded section to receive needles and pins, and could easily be rolled up

and carried about the person. Civilian ladies took up the idea and many beautiful hussifs were made in the 18th and 19th centuries.

After fifty or more years I still have my hussif in use.

WRAN Margaret Hall Memorial

26 July was the 75th anniversary of the death of WRAN Margaret Hall. WRAN Hall was the only women listed on the Honour Board for WWII at HMAS Moreton and the anniversary of her death was commemorated on the date by the planting of a tree in the CMDR Lachlan King Memorial Garden at HMAS Moreton.

The tree was planted by Fay Royle who served with Margaret at HMAS Moreton. Fay recalls having to learn the slow march to be in the Honour Guard at the funeral. This was

the first parade training she received.

The commemoration service was attended by representatives from the WRAAC and WRAAF Associations, Defence Women's Sub branch of the RSL and by representatives from DVA and the local Council representative.

EXSERVICEWOMEN'S GROVE OF HONOUR

On Thursday 31 October an Avenue of Honour in Anzac Park Toowoong, was dedicated to those local men who died in the Great War. Abutting the Avenue, a Grove of Honour (nine trees) was dedicated in a lovely service, to nine Brisbane defence nurses who died as a result of their service to the soldiers in that war.

The Lord Mayor of Brisbane, Councillor Adrian Schinner



performed the dedication with moving prayers and blessings given by an army chaplain and by Rev. Jacqui Hurren, Chaplain to the Council of Exservicewomen's Associations Qld.

The Avenue of Honour, in which the Grove is

incorporated, is comprised of trees which will produce red flowers symbolising the blood of the soldiers, the Grove is Lemon Myrtles, which will produce white flowers representing the aprons of the nurses.

The whole is overlooked by a young Gallipoli Pine sourced from the National Arboretum in Canberra. A seed brought back from Gallipoli by a returning soldier produced the Gallipoli Pine at the National War Memorial and all those in the Arboretum have come from that tree.

Sadly no defence nurses attended except the WRAAF Wing Commander who gave the address. Wendy Griggs and Lorrae Johnson were our representatives at the dedication, Margaret Jones was down from the Sunshine Coast to attend and our own Neridah Parke was present as a part of the Council's Parks and Garden team.

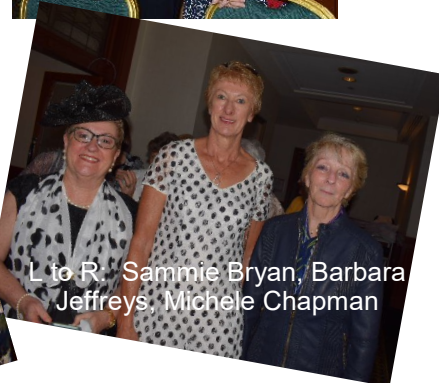

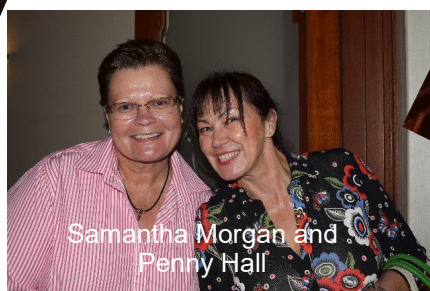
